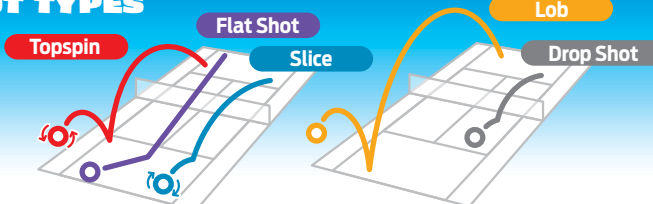

Take Shot

The 3-panel shot panel is displayed initially. Before serving, you can press (R) to cycle between the 3-panel shot panel, 3-panel shot panel (inverted), or 6-panel shot panel.

Simple Shot	(X)	Automatically performs an appropriate shot. Note: The best shot is selected automatically for Chance Shots, but it will be a slightly weaker version of that shot.
Topspin	(A)	A quick, arcing shot with a forward spin and high bounce.
Flat Shot	(Y)	The fastest shot. It has no spin.
Slice	(B)	A low-trajectory shot with a backward spin.
Lob	(A) → (B)	A shot with an extremely high arc that aims for the back of the court.
Drop Shot	(B) → (A)	A shot with little bounce that aims for the front of the court.

Note: You can press (R) to leap and hit balls that are slightly out of reach.

Note: You can serve and perform shots with a single command using Simple Shot.

CHANCE SHOTS

When a colored Chance Area appears, stand inside it and use the shot of the corresponding color to perform a powered-up version of that shot. If it's purple, press (Y) for a smash!



PLAYING IN DYNAMIC VIEW

If you hold the Nintendo 3DS system upright, your view will change, allowing you to play with an up-close perspective as though you were actually standing on the court. Your character will move automatically to chase the ball in this mode, making it a good choice for new players. You can also move your character freely with (C). Note: 3D is disabled automatically when playing in Dynamic View.



You can look around the court by moving the Nintendo 3DS left or right.



Your shots will be aimed in the direction you are looking.

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

- Mario Tennis Open Game Cards At least 1 (maximum of 1 per player)

Note: Players with their own Game Cards can play via Local Play.

Players without Game Cards can participate via Download Play.

CREATING A ROOM

ONE PLAYER WITH A GAME CARD

- 1 Select Local Multiplayer and then Create Room.
- 2 Once all of the players' names appear in the list, tap Start and follow the on-screen instructions to proceed.



JOINING A ROOM

PLAYERS WITH THEIR OWN GAME CARDS

- 1 Select Local Multiplayer and then tap the group you want to join, following the on-screen instructions to proceed.

PLAYERS WITHOUT THEIR OWN GAME CARDS

- 1 Select Download Play () at the HOME Menu, and then tap Open to launch it.
- 2 Tap the Nintendo 3DS logo, and then select Mario Tennis Open. (A player with the Game Card must create a room before Mario Tennis Open will be shown in the list.)
- 3 Wait for the game to start.

Note: The selection of characters and courts will be limited if any players do not have their own Game Card.



ONLINE PLAY

You can connect via the Internet to play with players online.

EXHIBITION

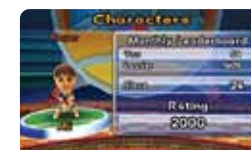
You can play Exhibition matches with up to three friends from your friend list. Follow the on-screen instructions to create a room, assemble or join a group, and begin playing.

You can register friends by accessing your friend list () from the HOME Menu. Please see the Nintendo 3DS Operations Manual for more information about friend lists.

OPEN MATCH

Take on players from across the region in singles play, and see how you stack up by comparing your rating with other players. Follow the on-screen instructions to play.

Your rating is an evaluation of your skill as a player. All players begin with a rating of 2000. If you win matches, your rating will go up. If you lose matches, it will fall.
